**ATTORNEYS’ FEES AND COSTS DECISION<sup>1</sup>**

On June 27, 2011, Mr. Vogler filed a petition seeking compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program (“the Vaccine Program”). On April 25, 2014, I dismissed Petitioner’s claim in a Decision on Entitlement.

On October 1, 2014, respondent filed a stipulation of attorneys’ fees and costs. Petitioner

Otherwise, the whole decision will be available to the public. (*Id.*)

seeks fees for his counsel, in the amount of \$20,000.00, in the form of a check payable jointly to Petitioner and his attorney, Firooz T. Namei. Additionally, Petitioner had filed a statement of costs in compliance with General Order No. 9, stating that he did not incur any additional costs while pursuing this claim. This amount represents a sum to which Respondent does not object.

I approve the requested amount for attorneys' fees and costs as reasonable. Accordingly, an award should be made in the form of a check for \$ 20,000.00 payable jointly to Petitioner and Petitioner's counsel, Firooz T. Namei. In the absence of a motion for review filed pursuant to RCFC Appendix B, the clerk of the court **SHALL ENTER JUDGMENT** in accordance with the terms of the parties' stipulation.<sup>2</sup>
