**UNPUBLISHED DECISION<sup>1</sup>**

Petitioner Sharon Bosco filed a motion for attorneys' fees and costs on March 5, 2015. On March 11, 2015, respondent filed a status report to indicate she has no objection to the amount requested. The Court awards the amount to which respondent does not object.

On November 21, 2013, Sharon Bosco filed a petition for compensation alleging that the measles, mumps, and rubella ("MMR") vaccine, which she received on March 24, 2011, caused her to suffer from sensorineural hearing loss ("SNHL"). Petitioner received compensation based upon the parties' stipulation.

Decision, filed October 22, 2014. Because petitioner received compensation, she is entitled to an award of attorneys' fees and costs. 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(e).

Petitioner seeks a total of **\$13,192.30** in attorneys' fees and **\$5,939.90** in attorneys' costs for her counsel. In compliance with General Order No. 9, petitioner has filed a statement indicating that she incurred no out-of-pocket litigation expenses while pursuing this claim. Respondent has no objection to the amount requested for attorneys' fees and costs.

After reviewing the request, the Court awards the following:

**A lump sum of \$19,132.20 in the form of a check made payable to petitioner and petitioner's attorney, Ronald Homer for attorneys' fees and other litigation costs available under 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(e).**

The Court thanks the parties for their cooperative efforts in resolving this matter. The Clerk shall enter judgment accordingly.
