DECISION AWARDING DAMAGES¹

On December 7, 2015, Bonnie Forman-Franco (“petitioner”) filed a petition for compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program (“the Program”).² Petitioner alleges that she suffered a shoulder injury, as a result of an influenza (“flu”) vaccine administered on December 30, 2013. Petition at Preamble. On December 19, 2019, the undersigned issued a ruling finding petitioner entitled to compensation. Ruling on Entitlement, dated Dec. 19, 2019 (ECF No. 113).

On July 24, 2020, respondent filed a Proffer on Award of Compensation (“Proffer”), attached hereto as Appendix A. (ECF No. 125). In the Proffer, respondent represented that

petitioner agrees with the proffered award. Proffer at 1. Based on the record as a whole, the undersigned finds that petitioner is entitled to an award as stated in the Proffer.

Pursuant to the terms stated in the attached Proffer, the undersigned awards:

A lump sum payment of \$95,000.00 in the form of a check made payable to petitioner, Bonnie Forman-Franco, for pain and suffering.

Proffer at 1.

In the absence of a motion for review filed pursuant to RCFC Appendix B, the Clerk of Court **SHALL ENTER JUDGMENT** herewith.³
