DECISION ON JOINT STIPULATION¹

On July 30, 2020, petitioner filed a petition on behalf of her deceased husband, Darryl Waldron (“decedent”), for compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, 42 U.S.C. §300aa-10, *et seq.*,² (the “Vaccine Act”). Petitioner alleges that the decedent suffered Guillain-Barre Syndrome (“GBS”) within the time period set forth in the Vaccine Injury Table relative to an influenza (“flu”) vaccination that he received on December 5, 2017. Petition at 1; Stipulation, filed October 21, 2024, at ¶¶ 2-4. Petitioner alleges that decedent’s illness resulted in his death. She further alleges that there has been no prior award or settlement of a civil action for damages as a result of his condition and that his vaccine was administered in the United States. Petition at 1, 4; Stipulation at ¶¶ 3-5. “Respondent denies that decedent sustained a GBS Table injury; denies that the flu vaccine caused decedent’s alleged GBS; and

denies that the flu vaccine caused decedent any other injury or decedent's death." Stipulation at ¶ 6.

Nevertheless, on October 21, 2024, the parties filed the attached joint stipulation, stating that a decision should be entered awarding compensation. I find the stipulation reasonable and adopt it as the decision of the Court in awarding damages, on the terms set forth therein.

Pursuant to the terms stated in the attached Stipulation, **I award the following compensation:**

A lump sum of \$140,000.00 in the form of a check payable to petitioner as legal representative of decedent's estate. Stipulation at ¶ 8. This amount represents compensation for all items of damages that would be available under § 15(a). *Id.*

In the absence of a motion for review filed pursuant to RCFC Appendix B, the clerk of the court is directed to enter judgment in accordance with this decision.³

STIPULATION

The parties hereby stipulate to the following matters:

1. Ayon Wen-Waldron (“petitioner”) filed a petition for vaccine compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, 42 U.S.C. §§ 300aa-10 to -34 (the “Vaccine Program”), as personal representative of the estate of Darryl Waldron (“decedent”). The petition seeks compensation for injuries allegedly related to decedent’s receipt of the influenza (“flu”) vaccine, which vaccine is contained in the Vaccine Injury Table (the “Table”), 42 C.F.R. § 100.3 (a).
2. Decedent received the flu vaccine on or about December 5, 2017.
3. The vaccination was administered within the United States.
4. Petitioner alleges that decedent suffered Guillain-Barré Syndrome (“GBS”) within the time period set forth in the Table. Petitioner further alleges that decedent’s “illness resulted in his death.”
5. Petitioner represents that there has been no prior award or settlement of a civil action for damages on decedent’s behalf as a result of decedent’s condition or death.

6. Respondent denies that decedent sustained a GBS Table injury; denies that the flu vaccine caused decedent's alleged GBS; and denies that the flu vaccine caused decedent any other injury or decedent's death.

7. Maintaining their above-stated positions, the parties nevertheless now agree that the issues between them shall be settled and that a decision should be entered awarding the compensation described in paragraph 8 of this Stipulation.

8. As soon as practicable after an entry of judgment reflecting a decision consistent with the terms of this Stipulation, and after petitioner has filed an election to receive compensation pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-21(a)(1), the Secretary of Health and Human Services will issue the following vaccine compensation payment:

A lump sum of **\$140,000.00** in the form of a check payable to petitioner as legal representative of decedent's estate. This amount represents all damages that would be available under 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(a).

9. As soon as practicable after the entry of judgment on entitlement in this case, and after petitioner has filed both a proper and timely election to receive compensation pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-21(a)(1), and an application, the parties will submit to further proceedings before the special master to award reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred in proceeding upon this petition.

10. Petitioner and petitioner's attorney represent that compensation to be provided pursuant to this Stipulation is not for any items or services for which the Program is not primarily liable under 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(g), to the extent that payment has been made or can reasonably be expected to be made under any State compensation programs, insurance policies, Federal or State health benefits programs (other than Title XIX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. § 1396 et seq.)), or by entities that provide health services on a pre-paid basis.

11. Payment made pursuant to paragraph 8 and any amounts awarded pursuant to paragraph 9 of this Stipulation will be made in accordance with 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(i), subject to the availability of sufficient statutory funds.

12. Petitioner represents that petitioner presently is, or within 90 days of the date of judgment will become, duly authorized to serve as the legal representative of decedent's estate under the laws of the State of Texas. No payments pursuant to this Stipulation shall be made until petitioner provides the Secretary with documentation establishing petitioner's appointment as legal representative of decedent's estate. If petitioner is not authorized by a court of competent jurisdiction to serve as legal representative of decedent's estate at the time a payment pursuant to this Stipulation is to be made, any such payment shall be paid to the party or parties appointed by a court of competent jurisdiction to serve as legal representative of decedent's estate upon submission of written documentation of such appointment to the Secretary.

13. In return for the payments described in paragraphs 8 and 9, petitioner, in petitioner's individual capacity and as personal representative of the Estate of decedent, on petitioner's own behalf, and on behalf of decedent's heirs, executors, administrators, successors, or assigns, does forever irrevocably and unconditionally release, acquit and discharge the United States and the Secretary of Health and Human Services from any and all actions or causes of action (including agreements, judgments, claims, damages, loss of services, expenses, and all demands of whatever kind or nature) that have been brought, could have been brought, or could be timely brought in the Court of Federal Claims, under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-10 et seq., on account of, or in any way growing out of, any and all known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected personal injuries to or death of decedent resulting from, or alleged to have resulted from, the flu vaccination administered on or about December 5,

2017, as alleged by petitioner in a petition for vaccine compensation filed on or about July 30, 2020, in the United States Court of Federal Claims as petition No. 20-928V.

14. If the special master fails to issue a decision in complete conformity with the terms of this Stipulation or if the Court of Federal Claims fails to enter judgment in conformity with a decision that is in complete conformity with the terms of this Stipulation, then the parties' settlement and this Stipulation shall be voidable at the sole discretion of either party.

15. This Stipulation expresses a full and complete negotiated settlement of liability and damages claimed under the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986, as amended, except as otherwise noted in paragraph 9 above. There is absolutely no agreement on the part of the parties hereto to make any payment or to do any act or thing other than is herein expressly stated and clearly agreed to. The parties further agree and understand that the award described in this Stipulation may reflect a compromise of the parties' respective positions as to liability and/or amount of damages, and further, that a change in the nature of the injury or condition or in the items of compensation sought, is not grounds to modify or revise this agreement.

16. This Stipulation shall not be construed as an admission by the United States or the Secretary of Health and Human Services that the flu vaccine caused decedent's alleged injury, or any other injury or decedent's death.


17. All rights and obligations of petitioner hereunder in petitioner's capacity as personal representative of decedent's estate shall apply equally to petitioner's heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and/or assigns.

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
