DECISION ON JOINT STIPULATION¹

Roth, Special Master:

On January 11, 2021, Teela Buscarini Wyman ["Ms. Wyman" or "petitioner"] filed a petition for compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program.² Petitioner alleges that she developed a shoulder injury related to vaccine administration ("SIRVA") after

receiving pneumococcal conjugate (“Pevnar 13”) and tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular-pertussis (“Tdap”) vaccines on July 9, 2020. Stipulation, filed May 17, 2023, at ¶¶ 1-4. Respondent denies that the aforementioned immunizations caused petitioner’s injury. Stipulation at ¶ 6.

Nevertheless, the parties have agreed to settle the case. On May 17, 2023, the parties filed a joint stipulation agreeing to settle this case and describing the settlement terms.

Respondent agrees to issue the following payment:

A lump sum of \$50,000.00 in the form of a check payable to petitioner, Teela Buscarini Wyman. This amount represents compensation for all damages that would be available under § 300aa-15(a).

I adopt the parties’ stipulation attached hereto, and award compensation in the amount and on the terms set forth therein. The clerk of the court is directed to enter judgment in accordance with this decision.³

IT IS SO ORDERED.

STIPULATION

The parties hereby stipulate to the following matters:

1. Teela Buscarini Wyman (“petitioner”) filed a petition for vaccine compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, 42 U.S.C. §§ 300aa-10 to -34 (the “Vaccine Program”). The petition seeks compensation for injuries allegedly related to petitioner’s receipt of pneumococcal conjugate (“Pevnar 13”) and tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular-pertussis (“Tdap”) vaccines, which are vaccines contained in the Vaccine Injury Table (the “Table”), 42 C.F.R. § 100.3(a).¹

2. Petitioner received the Pevnar 13 and Tdap vaccines on July 9, 2020, in her right arm.²

¹ “Petition,” as used herein, refers to petitioner’s second amended petition, filed on December 13, 2021. ECF No. 30. Petitioner’s initial and first amended petitions incorrectly referenced the human papillomavirus (“HPV”) vaccine as having been administered in her right arm. *See* ECF Nos. 1, 10. Petitioner does not allege that the HPV vaccine, administered in her left arm, caused her to suffer a right shoulder injury, or any other injury or condition.

² On July 9, 2020, petitioner also received the haemophilus B (“Hib”), polio, and hepatitis A-hepatitis B recombinant vaccines in her left arm. Petitioner does not allege that these vaccines caused her to suffer a shoulder injury, or any other injury or condition.

3. The vaccinations were administered within the United States.

4. Petitioner alleges that she suffered from a right shoulder injury related to vaccination administration ("SIRVA") within the time period set forth in the Table following administration of the Prevnar 13 and Tdap vaccines, and suffered the residual effects of her alleged injury for more than six months.

5. Petitioner represents that there has been no prior award or settlement of a civil action for damages on her behalf as a result of her condition.

6. Respondent denies that petitioner sustained a Table injury for SIRVA, and denies that the Prevnar 13 or Tdap vaccine caused petitioner to suffer a right shoulder injury or any other injury, and denies that her current condition is a sequelae of a vaccine-related injury.

7. Maintaining their above-stated positions, the parties nevertheless now agree that the issues between them shall be settled and that a decision should be entered awarding the compensation described in paragraph 8 of this Stipulation.

8. As soon as practicable after an entry of judgment reflecting a decision consistent with the terms of this Stipulation, and after petitioner has filed an election to receive compensation pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-21(a)(1), the Secretary of Health and Human Services will issue the following vaccine compensation payment:

A lump sum of \$50,000.00 in the form of a check payable to petitioner. This amount represents compensation for all damages that would be available under 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(a).

9. As soon as practicable after the entry of judgment on entitlement in this case, and after petitioner has filed both a proper and timely election to receive compensation pursuant to

42 U.S.C. § 300aa-21(a)(1), and an application, the parties will submit to further proceedings before the special master to award reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred in proceeding upon this petition.

10. Petitioner and her attorney represent that compensation to be provided pursuant to this Stipulation is not for any items or services for which the Program is not primarily liable under 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(g), to the extent that payment has been made or can reasonably be expected to be made under any State compensation programs, insurance policies, Federal or State health benefits programs (other than Title XIX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. § 1396 et seq.)), or by entities that provide health services on a pre-paid basis.

11. Payment made pursuant to paragraph 8 of this Stipulation and any amounts awarded pursuant to paragraph 9 of this Stipulation will be made in accordance with 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(i), subject to the availability of sufficient statutory funds.

12. The parties and their attorneys further agree and stipulate that, except for any award for attorneys' fees and litigation costs, and past unreimbursed expenses, the money provided pursuant to this Stipulation will be used solely for the benefit of petitioner as contemplated by a strict construction of 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(a) and (d), and subject to the conditions of 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(g) and (h).

13. In return for the payments described in paragraphs 8 and 9, petitioner, in her individual capacity, and on behalf of her heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns, does forever irrevocably and unconditionally release, acquit and discharge the United States and the Secretary of Health and Human Services from any and all actions or causes of action (including agreements, judgments, claims, damages, loss of services, expenses and all demands of whatever kind or nature) that have been brought, could have been brought, or could be timely

brought in the Court of Federal Claims, under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-10 et seq., on account of, or in any way growing out of, any and all known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected personal injuries to or death of petitioner resulting from, or alleged to have resulted from, the vaccines administered on July 9, 2020, as identified by petitioner in her petition for vaccine compensation filed on or about January 11, 2021, and in an amended petition filed on or about December 13, 2021, in the United States Court of Federal Claims as petition No. 21-553V.

14. If petitioner should die prior to entry of judgment, this agreement shall be voidable upon proper notice to the Court on behalf of either or both of the parties.


15. If the special master fails to issue a decision in complete conformity with the terms of this Stipulation or if the Court of Federal Claims fails to enter judgment in conformity with a decision that is in complete conformity with the terms of this Stipulation, then the parties' settlement and this Stipulation shall be voidable at the sole discretion of either party.

16. This Stipulation expresses a full and complete negotiated settlement of liability and damages claimed under the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986, as amended, except as otherwise noted in paragraph 9 above. There is absolutely no agreement on the part of the parties hereto to make any payment or to do any act or thing other than is herein expressly stated and clearly agreed to. The parties further agree and understand that the award described in this Stipulation may reflect a compromise of the parties' respective positions as to liability and/or amount of damages, and further, that a change in the nature of the injury or condition or in the items of compensation sought, is not grounds to modify or revise this agreement.

17. This Stipulation shall not be construed as an admission by the United States or the Secretary of Health and Human Services that petitioner sustained a Table injury, or that the
